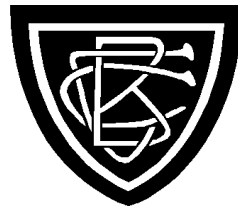

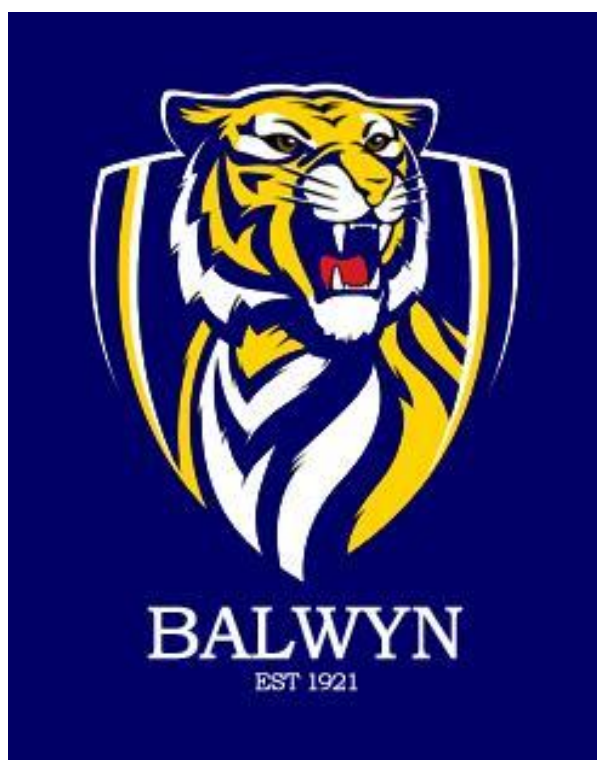

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

**Presented to members and visitors online on Monday 31st July, 2023.**

The Board of Management of the Balwyn Cricket Club Incorporated presents for adoption the 103rd Annual Report & Associated Statements of accounts for season 2022-23.

In season 2022-23, the Balwyn Cricket Club fielded four senior teams in the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA), three junior teams in the ECA, three youth teams in the Inner South East Cricket (ISEC) association and a representative side in the JG Craig Under 15 competition.

This season, the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> XI's played in the East-West group, whilst the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> XI's played in the South-East group. Led again by Lachlan Fitpatrick, the 1<sup>st</sup> XI had a similar year to 2021/22, achieving some impressive victories but ultimately just failing to make finals. Clinton Kennon led the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI, and the team had a fantastic season ultimately winning the flag. The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI was led by Brendon Hoornweg for the first time, and despite a positive season, just missed out on playing finals. In the 4<sup>th</sup> XI, the boys were unable to repeat last year's success and ultimately lost in the Qualifying Final.

In 2022/23, Clinton Kennon was again Club Coach. Clinton did a fantastic job in leading the Club on-field, driving a positive and fun culture which was appreciated by all players. Thanks also to the rest of the captains, who formed the balance of the Match Committee and ensured that we were competitive and well prepared throughout the senior sides.

The Club this year fielded six junior/youth sides. The organisation of this vital component of the Club continues to be successfully undertaken by Chris Wilks and provides the Club with much optimism for future years. We thank Chris for his significant contribution to the junior programme, as well as the numerous coaches and team managers who make the junior programme the success that it is today. To those parents that were involved in coaching or other match day contributions we welcome your contributions, thank you for your assistance and interest, and hope that ultimately it will translate into watching your kids and their friends become senior players at Balwyn Cricket Club.

The JG Craig Shield Under 15 representative squad coached for the first time by Vihaan Narayana and Jack Lyndon, and managed by Chris Wilks. The boys had a fantastic season and ultimately finished as the 2023 champions - congratulations to all involved!

Off the field, the Club's centenary celebrations at the Melbourne Cricket Ground were undoubtedly a highlight. Many thanks to all involved in bringing this event together (particularly Patrick, Dom and Jake), and to those club members that joined us on the night.

The Club's financial outcome for 2022/23 is covered off in depth by our Honorary Treasurer Adam Janes in his report. We thank Adam for his efforts in this role over the last two seasons, and helping to steer the Club through some difficult financial times. Outside of the Club, our relationship with the VSDCA this season was administered in an effective and positive manner. In particular, we offer our thanks to the Secretary, Ken Hilton.

We are indebted to the VSDCA's major sponsor Kookaburra for their support by way of stumps, match balls and promotional material. Thanks also to other VSDCA sponsors including Bendigo Bank, Memorabilia Warehouse, Club Connect, Fleximake and Shaun Brown's Cricket Coaching. On matters closer to home we again thank the City of Boroondara (CoB) for their ongoing support.

At Balwyn Cricket Club we recognise that we have community obligations beyond our sport and to that end we continue our involvement in the 'Good Sports' program. This is a national program that promotes a cultural change in sporting clubs away from the negative effects of alcohol use and towards a community and family focus with an emphasis on respecting the safe licensed venue we have. We hope that this initiative coupled with the practical application of the fundamentals within the program, will encourage all parents to continue to view the Balwyn Cricket Club as the club of choice for their children and their friends.

The contribution of various members of the committee co-ordinating club functions is also greatly appreciated. We also thank our many past players who attended the limited number of in-person events this year and contributed to the Club through the Balwyn Foundation. It is hoped that these initiatives, being one of the bridges that keeps our past players actively engaged in the well-being of our Club, will grow substantially next season given the marked year-on-year reduction experienced this season.

We thank all our sponsors who were a huge supporter of the Club in Season 2022/23 in another challenging year for the community. We were delighted with the support of all our sponsors including the Bendigo Bank, Accru, Clas Shower Screens and Sumapark.

Finally, a big thank you to my wife Olivia and daughters Matilda and Hazel who's ongoing love and support allows me to continue to support the Club off the field.

We look forward to further growth and success in Season 2022-23.

- Lachlan Fitzpatrick, captain of the 1st XI, Brendan Hoornweg, captain of the 3rd XI and those who rotate through the role in the 4ths.
- Richard Gill for his role as scorer of both the 1st and 2nd XIs.
- Andrew Sheehan for acting in the capacity of the Club's accounts keeper.
- All Committee Members, who have all worked co-operatively and diligently, for their ongoing service to the Club, particularly my old friend and team mate Alex Young.
- Finally, thanks to all others who assisted the Club in a volunteer capacity over the course of the season. The Club relies upon and values your support greatly.

The next challenge for us on-field is to take a further leap forward on the Club Championship table, and to have a First XI competing regularly in the Finals. We can't be satisfied until we accomplish those goals.

Finally, I would like to record my great optimism for our club's future. It is a source of significant personal pride that we now have a new wave of emerging leaders who I know will carry the Balwyn Cricket Club extremely well into the future. I hope that our best days lie ahead.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

From an accounting perspective, the Club has recorded an operating loss for the financial year ended 30 April 2023 of (\$27,986.78), with a 'true' cash loss for the Club of (\$21,920.50).

While these figures sound alarming, it is worth noting that this largely includes a one-off cost of \$19,372 for the Centenary Function. Furthermore, a 22% increase in Ground Rent from prior year (c. \$3,134), an increase of 47% on Food & Beverage expense (c. \$5,571) and a combined expense increase of 42% (c. \$6,715) for Balls & Cost Apparel Sales, proved to be significant expenditure increases for the Club. Unfortunately, the revenue from the Centenary Dinner, compounded by the 93% & 82% decrease in income from the Foundation and Grants respectively, could not offset the highlighted expenses.

In Season 2022/23, the Club continued to bare fruits of prompt payment of season subscriptions through the Senior and Junior ranks, in addition to the Golden Tiger coterie. This is a testament to the driven nature of the committee to procure funds and the behavioural shift in the playing group. Additionally, the investment in the Square Terminal has and will continue enhance the Club's reporting ability to understand the greatest revenue generating products, which will enable cost controlling in order to maximise profitability.

As noted in prior years, the Club continues to struggle to replace the significant contribution that was provided by the Administration Grant from Cricket Victoria. While acknowledging this type of funding will not return in the near future, it is important to stress that the future cricket administrators need to develop multiple revenue generating strategies that would ensure sustainable financial support is provided to the Club, assisting in the development of the next generation of representative players.

Such strategies include:

- Maintaining strong cost discipline.
- Maximising revenue from social events & Grants.
- Marketing strategies to increase awareness of the Raffle & Foundation to maintain consistent income year-on-year.
- Continue to imbed the culture of full subscription payments prior to the commencement of each season.
- Maximising cash flow from the prior years investment in apparel and minimising the spend on new stock.

With the aforementioned recommendations, the Club requires the support of its entire community of players, past players, parents and supporters in order to imbed the healthy ways of working into the Club to ensure it continues to thrive for generations to come.

## THE CLUB CHAMPIONS

From 1949-50 the best-performed player in the 1<sup>st</sup> XI was awarded the club champion trophy (Lindsay Traeger Trophy). In 1978 the club champion was re named the **JL Seelenmeyer Trophy** in honour of Jack who had died the previous year.

The **BA Provan Trophy** was created in 1985 with players in all teams being eligible for the award. The winner of the **JL Seelenmeyer Trophy** was thereafter referred to as the 1<sup>st</sup> XI champion but was not eligible to win both awards.

Both awards are decided on a points formula for runs, assisted wickets, unassisted wickets, catches, stumpings, run outs direct and run outs assisted. The **BA Provan Trophy** includes points awarded for home and away fixtures only.

**NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS****1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies**

This special purpose financial report has been prepared for distribution to the members to fulfil the Committee of Management's financial reporting requirements under the Club's constitution and Cricket Victoria's Criteria Assessment. The accounting policies used in the preparation of this financial report, as described below, are consistent with the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Victoria) and the Club's constitution and with previous years, and are, in the opinion of the Committee of Management, appropriate to meet the needs of members:

- a. The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis of accounting including the historical cost convention and the going concern assumption.
- b. The requirements of Accounting Standards and other financial reporting requirements in Australia do not have mandatory applicability to Balwyn Cricket Club Incorporated because it is not a "reporting entity". No other applicable Accounting Standards, Accounting Interpretations or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied. The report is also prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report:

- (a) **Income Tax**  
No provision for Income Tax has been raised as the club is exempt from Income Tax under Division 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.
- (b) **Fixed Assets**  
Fixed assets are carried at cost, less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation.

The depreciable amounts of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the club commencing from the time the asset was held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease or the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The carrying amount of fixed assets is reviewed annually by committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount of those assets.

The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows which will be received from the assets employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have not been discounted to their present values in determining recoverable amounts.

- (c) **Goods & Services Tax (GST)**  
Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of expense. Debtors and Creditors in the Balance Sheet are shown inclusive of GST.
- (d) **Comparative Figures**  
Where required by Accounting Standards comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current financial year.
