ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

Presented to members and visitors online on Monday 15th July, 2024.

The Board of Management of the Balwyn Cricket Club Incorporated presents for adoption the 103rd Annual Report & Associated Statements of accounts for season 2023-24.

In season 2023-24, the Balwyn Cricket Club fielded four senior teams in the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA), three junior teams in the ECA, three youth teams in the Inner South East Cricket (ISEC) association and a representative side in the JG Craig Under 15 competition.

This season, all four XI's played in the South-East group. Led again by Lachlan Fitpatrick, the 1st XI had a similar year to 2021/22 and 2022/23, achieving some impressive victories but ultimately just failing to make finals. Clinton Kennon led the 2nd XI, and the team had a fantastic season despite ultimately finishing runner-up. The 3rd XI was led by Jon Thiele for the first time, and had a very positive season, making the first round of finals. In the 4th XI, the boys had a positive season but were unable to make finals, ultimately finishing sixth.

In 2023/24, Clinton Kennon was again Club Coach. Clinton did a fantastic job in leading the Club onfield, driving a positive and fun culture which was appreciated by all players. Clinton has now announced his resignation from the role and we offer our sincere gratitude and appreciation to Clinton for his tireless efforts in the role over the years. Thanks also to the rest of the captains, who formed the balance of the Match Committee and ensured that we were competitive and well prepared throughout the senior sides.

The Club this year fielded six junior/youth sides. The organisation of this vital component of the Club continues to be successfully undertaken by Chris Wilks and provides the Club with much optimism for future years. We thank Chris for his significant contribution to the junior programme, as well as the numerous coaches and team managers who make the junior programme the success that it is today. To those parents that were involved in coaching or other match day contributions we welcome your contributions, thank you for your assistance and interest, and hope that ultimately it will translate into watching your kids and their friends become senior players at Balwyn Cricket Club.

The JG Craig Shield Under 15 representative squad was coached again by Vihaan Narayana and Jack Lyndon, and managed by Chris Wilks. The boys had a good tournament but ultimately weren't able to repeat the prior year's winning result, ultimately finishing third in the East group and missing out on finals.

The Club's financial outcome for 2023/24 is covered off in depth by our Honorary Treasurer Tom Gill in his report. We thank Tom for his efforts in his new role this season. Outside of the Club, our relationship with the VSDCA this season was administered in an effective and positive manner. In particular, we offer our thanks to the Secretary, Ken Hilton.

At this point it is fantastic to be able to acknowledge former Balwyn CC President and Life Member James Sheehan who was also appointed as a LIfe Member of the VSDCA this season. James' many accomplishments for Balwyn and the VSDCA are outlined in the Club's nomination letter (see page 6) and we all wish to congratulate James on this fantastic and well deserved achievement.

We are indebted to the VSDCA's major sponsor Kookaburra for their support by way of stumps, match balls and promotional material. Thanks also to other VSDCA sponsors including Bendigo Bank, Memorabilia Warehouse, Club Connect, Fleximake and Shaun Brown's Cricket Coaching. On matters closer to home we again thank the City of Boroondara (CoB) for their ongoing support.

At Balwyn Cricket Club we recognise that we have community obligations beyond our sport and to that end we continue our involvement in the 'Good Sports' program. This is a national program that promotes a cultural change in sporting clubs away from the negative effects of alcohol use and towards a community and family focus with an emphasis on respecting the safe licensed venue we have. We hope that this initiative coupled with the practical application of the fundamentals within the

program, will encourage all parents to continue to view the Balwyn Cricket Club as the club of choice for their children and their friends.

The contribution of various members of the committee co-ordinating club functions is also greatly appreciated. We also thank our many past players who attended the limited number of in-person events this year and contributed to the Club through the Balwyn Foundation. It is hoped that these initiatives, being one of the bridges that keeps our past players actively engaged in the well-being of our Club, will grow substantially next season given the marked year-on-year reduction experienced this season.

We thank all our sponsors who were a huge supporter of the Club in Season 2023/24 in another challenging year for the community. We were delighted with the support of all our sponsors including the Bendigo Bank, Accru, Clas Shower Screens and Sumapark.

Finally, a big thank you to my wife Olivia and daughters Matilda and Hazel who's ongoing love and support allows me to continue to support the Club off the field.

We look forward to further growth and success in Season 2024-25.

The Balwyn Cricket Club entered the 2024/25 season with great anticipation and a hunger for success. - Sponsorship: increased sponsorship from seasons prior and offering different levels of sponsorship to local businesses.
- Female Cricket: the club is hoping to integrate a female program and pathway into senior cricket at our club. This strategy will be fully explored and shared with our members towards the start of next season.

In summary, Balwyn have shown to be a powerful and well respected club yet again. Balwyn is built off terrific volunteers and members who care for each other and the club. Balwyn should be proud of the community we have built at our cricket club with many friendships formed and created. I would like to thank you all for your co-operation, diligence and effort into making Balwyn the best cricket club it can be and hopefully even better into the future.

TREASURER'S REPORT

From an accounting perspective, the Club has recorded a profit for the financial year ended 30 April 2024 of \$1,4710.04 and a 'true' cash increase of \$5,670.94. This is a turn in the right direction for the club after a disappointing 2022/23 year financially. With plenty of improvements still to be made and efficiencies to be capitalised on throughout the coming seasons the outlook for the Club is overall positive.

It should be noted that all of the club's debtors have now been received and all liabilities have been paid. We will begin the 2024/25 season with no financial obligations and a strong stock position which gives a good platform to build on the growth seen this year.

In the 2023/24 season, the Club benefitted greatly from the following items:

- The implementation of the square system on a club-wide basis. This has enabled us to collect payments efficiently and track both bar and uniform stock more accurately. The uniform ordering system through the square uniform shop means we are able to collect all payments before uniform is delivered to players, limiting the club's liability.
- The continued access to Accru sponsorship.
- Strong relationships built with suppliers enabling us to capitalise on various deals and discounts.
- Steady contributions through our Golden Tiger membership offering.
- The ability to be able to use the clubrooms for social functions, from which we generated significant revenue.

Overall, operating revenue was up by approximately 22% year-on-year, largely due to growth seen in income from social and fund-raising activities and an increase in apparel sales. This increase has been slightly offset by reduced subscriptions from both the playing group and the Golden Tigers.

The Club has been able to manage costs well throughout the year, with total expenditure approximately \$10k lower than prior year. The obvious decreases being due to the one-off cost of the centenary dinner last year and lower council rent this season.

The introduction of a new umpire payment system across the VSDCA saw us pay approximately \$15k in these fees whilst only bringing in approximately \$12k relating to umpires. It should be noted that the expense line relates to both seniors and juniors and the junior umpire fees are largely paid for as part of their registration fees which explains a portion of this difference. The club will continue to strategise on the best way of collecting umpire payment going forward.

New expenditure in the form of Frog Box subscription and associated fees will be a staple of the future with Balwyn having now adopted the live streaming tool. Whilst this is an extra cost that will be borne by the club it is also worth recognising the capability it has to help generate revenue through sponsorship and generate exposure of Balwyn CC as a whole. The committee is working to find ways to use the Frog Box not only as an entertainment tool but as a source of financial benefit.

As noted in prior years, the Club continues to struggle to replace the significant contribution that was provided by the Administration Grant from Cricket Victoria. While acknowledging recent events may mean it is unlikely this type of funding will return in the near future, it is important to stress that cricket administrators need to develop plans that would ensure genuine financial support is provided to grass roots cricket clubs to assist in the development of the next generation of representative players.

The financial challenges for upcoming 2024/25 season are no less significant:

- Maintaining strong cost discipline
- Continuing the improvements in revenue from social events
- Maximising revenue from recent apparel investment and minimising spend on new stock
- Rebuilding the Foundation and Grants activities which were down this year
- Securing funds and cost savings through various forms of sponsorship initiatives

The Club requires the support of its entire community of players, past players, parents and supporters in order to continue to survive and thrive as a strong turf cricket club in the VSDCA competition.

The **BA Provan Trophy** was created in 1985 with players in all teams being eligible for the award. The winner of the **JL Seelenmeyer Trophy** was thereafter referred to as the 1st XI champion but was not eligible to win both awards.

Both awards are decided on a points formula for runs, assisted wickets, unassisted wickets, catches, stumpings, run outs direct and run outs assisted. The **BA Provan Trophy** includes points awarded for home and away fixtures only.

WOOLWORTHS CRICKET BLAST

Woolworths Cricket Blast is a 10-week program run on Saturday mornings from the middle of November until the start of March with a break over the summer holidays. There were 10 children in the program. Each week about 4-8 children turned up.

Sessions were planned and run using the Cricket Australia Coaching App, which had week by week 'Ready to Go Sessions'. 


