ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

Presented to members and visitors at Gordon Barnard Reserve on Monday 27 July 2020.

The Board of Management of the Balwyn Cricket Club Incorporated presents for adoption the 100th Annual Report & Associated Statements of accounts for season 2019-20.

In season 2019-20, the Balwyn Cricket Club fielded four senior teams in the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA), four junior teams in the ECA, two junior teams in the Inner South-East Cricket (ISEC) association and a representative side in the JG Craig Under 15 competition.

This season the 1st and 2nd XI's played in the East-West group, and the 3rd and 4th XI played in the South-East group. Led by Clinton Kennon, the 1st XI had a slightly disappointing season, ultimately finishing 13th in the group. Brendon Hoornweg led the 2nd XI for the first time, and they ultimately finished in 10th place. The 3rd XI was unable to repeat their success from the prior season and finished 9th. Despite finishing 13th, the 4th XI fielded some great young talent and improved towards the back end of the season.

In 2019/20, Clinton Kennon was Club Coach for the first time. Clinton did a fantastic job in leading the Club on-field, driving a positive and fun culture which was appreciated by all players. Thanks also to the rest of the captains, who formed the balance of the Match Committee and ensured that we were competitive and well prepared throughout the senior sides.

The Club this year fielded five junior sides. The organisation of this vital component of the Club continues to be successfully undertaken by Chris Wilks and provides the Club with much optimism for future years. We thank Chris for his significant contribution to the junior programme, as well as the numerous coaches and team managers who make the junior programme the success that it is today. To those parents that were involved in coaching or other match day contributions we welcome your contributions, thank you for your assistance and interest, and hope that ultimately it will translate in to watching your kids and their friends become senior players at Balwyn Cricket Club.

The JG Craig Shield Under 15 representative squad was again coached by Lachlan Fitzpatrick, and managed by Chris Wilks. The boys enjoyed playing together and ultimately had a fantastic campaign, making the Grand Final and finishing runners-up to the perennially strong Bayswater. With Fitzzy taking up the role of 1st XI Captain from next season, a new Coach will shortly be appointed. We thank Fitzzy for his outstanding efforts over the last two campaigns, and wish Chris all the best next season.

This season the Club was extremely saddened by the sudden passing of Life Member Elizabeth Orr. Elizabeth's contribution to, and impact on, the Club was profound. The junior program in particular would not be what it is today without Elizabeth's involvement and we are indebted to Elizabeth and her family for this. The Club once again passes on its sincere condolences to the Orr family.

The Club's financial outcome for 2019/20 is covered off in depth by our Honorary Treasurer Andy Sheehan in his report. We thank Andy for stepping into the role this season and helping to steer the Club through some difficult financial times. Outside of the Club, our relationship with the VSDCA this season was administered in an effective and positive manner. In particular, we offer our thanks to the Secretary Ken Hilton.

We are indebted to the VSDCA's major sponsor Kookaburra for their support by way of stumps, match balls and promotional material. Thanks also to other VSDCA sponsors including Gage Roads Brewing Co, Memorabilia Warehouse, Kookaburra and Icon. On matters closer to home we again thank the City of Boroondara (CoB) for their ongoing support.

At Balwyn Cricket Club we recognise that we have community obligations beyond our sport and to that end we continue our involvement in the 'Good Sports' program. This is a national program that promotes a cultural change in sporting clubs away from the negative effects of alcohol use and

towards a community and family focus with an emphasis on respecting the safe licensed venue we have. We hope that this initiative coupled with the practical application of the fundamentals within the program, will encourage all parents to continue to view the Balwyn Cricket Club as the club of choice for their children and their friends.

The contribution of various members of the committee co-ordinating club functions is also greatly appreciated. James Sheehan and Patrick Tuohey again oversaw the successful President's Lunch which included special guest, former Australian and Victorian cricketer David Hussey. We also thank our many past players who attended events and contributed to the Club through taking up Golden Tiger coterie memberships. It is hoped that this initiative, being one of the bridges that keeps our past players actively engaged in the well-being of our Club, will grow substantially again next season.

We thank all our sponsors who were a huge supporter of the Club in Season 2019/20. We were delighted with the support of all our sponsors including the Balwyn branch of Bendigo Bank, Accru, Clas Shower Screens, Apollo Technology, Sumapark, MyLife and Jellis Craig.

From an administrative perspective, Michael Letcher continued to provide outstanding support to the Club as our MyCricket Coordinator. Thank you also to Stephen Hardy who continued in the role of Club Umpire this year. Both are time-consuming tasks but ones which provide enormous benefits to the Club.

We look forward to further growth and success in Season 2020-21.

10 years ago (2009-10)

- The 1st and 2nd XI's were both a mathematical possibility of playing finals as they entered the final home and away game against Brunswick however a late afternoon storm put paid to any finals after both sides were well placed.
- The 4th XI won a premiership from 4th position and breaking a run of six successive 5th placings. For the fifth successive year the 3rd XI again qualified for finals after finishing the regular season in 3rd position. Unfortunately they were unable to progress beyond the semi final suffering a narrow loss to Preston.
- Season 2009-10 saw the arrival of a new coach in Ben Hanley. Ben McLeod, Travis Miles, and a resurgent Patrick Tuohey formed the nucleus of a well performed 1st XI. Others such as Andrew Walpole, Thomas Jacob, Daniel Kiely and Matthew Jones were regularly well performed players at higher levels than they had previously played and this reflected well on the leadership of Ben.

20 years ago (1999-00)

- The 1st XI narrowly missed finals with new recruits Craig Howard and James Lowrie featuring prominently under the leadership of Paul Coloe.
- Committee members Patrick Tuohey and Chris Wilks were bowling trophy winners. Geoff Kiker celebrated his marriage to Nicole and his first century for the club.
- The Annual Report made mention of the increasing financial burden faced with the introduction of Mr Costello's GST.

30 years ago (1989-90)

- The 1st XI were to finish 5th, half a game outside the top four. The team was to lose only four games, all to the sides that played finals.
- Bud Walder was to play his 200th 1st XI game during the season which was celebrated at a Melbourne Cup eve function. This was one of eight functions during the season which also saw the inaugural Balwyn Fest.
- Newly appointed 3rd XI captain Brendan Moore oversaw a third consecutive failed finals campaign. He and Brendan Keilar did however score their maiden centuries for the club.
- Andy Lee (of Hamish and Andy fame) was the recipient of the Under 12 all rounder award in what was also John Farmer's first year as President.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2019/2020 on-field season for the Balwyn Cricket Club shaped as one of significant challenge from the outset. - Finally, but also most importantly, the return of a positive culture to Balwyn Cricket Club based on "RESPECT". We will never again lose sight of a team first mindset. We will rise and fall together.

I am confident that, taking all of the above into account, the Club will look back on this season as the foundation upon which our future success was built.

I would like to congratulate all of the award winners in 2019/2020. Cricket can be a tough game, and you should be proud of your individual achievements.

However, we play a team game, and at Balwyn we will always strive for team success. That is the next challenge that lies ahead for us all.

To this end, the Club is delighted to announce the appointment of Lachlan Fitzpatrick as 1st XI Captain for season 2020/2021.

In this role, Lachlan will work closely with current Club Coach, Clinton Kennon. The Club is equally pleased that Clinton will continue in his role.

The Committee are confident that we now have in place an excellent on-field leadership team that will build on the gains of the season just gone, and lead the Club to success in the future.

In relation to off field issues, the Club's operating environment continues to be difficult from a financial perspective. The Club focussed on strong cost discipline this season. However, generating sustainable income streams remains a significant challenge. This will continue to be the case in a post COVID-19 world. It requires all members of the Balwyn cricket community (players past and present, supporters, sponsors, family members etc) to play an active role. THE CLUB CHAMPIONS

From 1949-50 the best-performed player in the 1st XI was awarded the club champion trophy (Lindsay Traeger Trophy). In 1978 the club champion was re named the **JL Seelenmeyer Trophy** in honour of Jack who had died the previous year.

The **BA Provan Trophy** was created in 1985 with players in all teams being eligible for the award. The winner of the **JL Seelenmeyer Trophy** was thereafter referred to as the 1st XI champion but was not eligible to win both awards.

Both awards are decided on a points formula for runs, assisted wickets, unassisted wickets, catches, stumpings, run outs direct and run outs assisted. The **BA Provan Trophy** includes points awarded for home and away fixtures only.

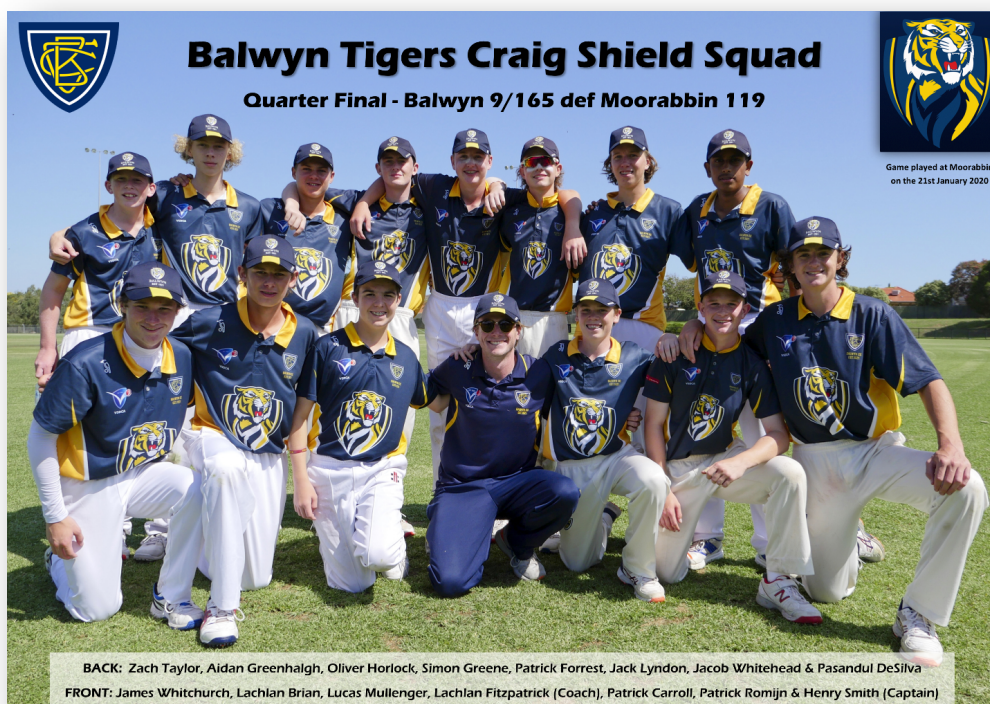

Congratulations to all players for their efforts this season. Well done on a solid year. We look forward to seeing you all again next season.



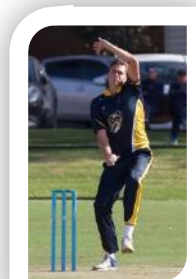
