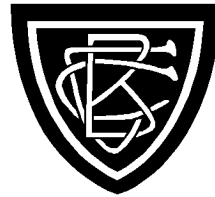

## ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

**Presented to members and visitors at Gordon Barnard Reserve on Monday 29 July 2019.**

The Board of Management of the Balwyn Cricket Club Incorporated presents for adoption the 99<sup>th</sup> Annual Report & Associated Statements of accounts for season 2018-19.

In season 2018-19, the Balwyn Cricket Club fielded four senior teams in the Victorian Sub-District Cricket Association (VSDCA), four junior teams in the ECA, two junior teams in the Inner South-East Cricket (ISEC) association and a representative side in the JG Craig Under 15 competition.

This season all four XI's played in the North-East group. Led by Steven Duckworth, the 1<sup>st</sup> XI had a disappointing season, ultimately finishing 13<sup>th</sup> in the group. Unlike the prior season, the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI was unable to reach the finals, ultimately finishing in 7<sup>th</sup> place. The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI was the pick of the elevens, getting on a great run to make the Grand Final and ultimately finishing runners-up. Despite finishing 11<sup>th</sup>, the 4<sup>th</sup> XI fielded some great young talent and improved towards the back end of the season.

In 2018/19, Steven Duckworth was once again Club Coach. This is Steve's last season at the Club and we thank him for his contributions over the past three seasons. Thanks also to the rest of the captains, who formed the balance of the Match Committee and ensured that we were competitive and well prepared throughout the senior sides.

The Club this year fielded five junior sides. The organisation of this vital component of the Club continues to be successfully undertaken by Chris Wilks and provides the Club with much optimism for future years. We thank Chris for his significant contribution to the junior programme, as well as the numerous coaches and team managers who make the junior programme the success that it is today. To those parents that were involved in coaching or other match day contributions we welcome your contributions, thank you for your assistance and interest, and hope that ultimately it will translate in to watching your kids and their friends become senior players at Balwyn Cricket Club.

The JG Craig Shield Under 15 representative squad was coached for the first time by Lachlan Fitzpatrick, and managed by Chris Wilks. Despite recording only one win, the boys enjoyed playing together against some of the best players in the region. With Fitzzy and Chris continuing their involvement next season, we look forward to further success.

The Club's financial outcome for 2017/18 is covered off in depth by our Honorary Treasurer Patrick Tuohey in his report. We thank Patrick for his ongoing efforts to help steer the Club through some difficult financial times. Outside of the Club, our relationship with the VSDCA this season was administered in an effective and positive manner. In particular, we offer our thanks to the Secretary Ken Hilton.

We are indebted to the VSDCA's major sponsor Kookaburra for their support by way of stumps, match balls and promotional material. Thanks also to other VSDCA sponsors including Cricketers Arms, Schweppes, Legends & Heroes, Zapparas Lawyers, BLK and Somersby. On matters closer to home we again thank the City of Boroondara (CoB) for their ongoing support. We appreciate the sound administrative support in particular from Steven Jackson and Kate Picking.

At Balwyn Cricket Club we recognise that we have community obligations beyond our sport and to that end we continue our involvement in the 'Good Sports' program. This is a national program that promotes a cultural change in sporting clubs away from the negative effects of alcohol use and towards a community and family focus with an emphasis on respecting the safe licensed venue we have. We hope that this initiative coupled with the practical application of the fundamentals within the program, will encourage all parents to continue to view the Balwyn Cricket Club as the club of choice for their children and their friends.

The contribution of various members of the committee co-ordinating club functions is also greatly appreciated. This year also saw the continuation of a Past Player Liaison sub-committee comprising of James Sheehan and Patrick Tuohey, who oversaw the successful President's Lunch which included special guests, former Australian Test Bowler Merv Hughes. We also thank our many past players who attended events and contributed to the Club through taking up Golden Tiger coterie memberships. It is hoped that this initiative, being one of the bridges that keeps our past players actively engaged in the well-being of our Club, will grow substantially again next season.

Life membership does not just recognise the long association with a club, but it also recognises leadership and distinguished service. Well done on the well-deserved recognition of your dedication and commitment.

As I step down as President, to all our members, players and their families, thank-you for your support over the past two years. It has been an honour to be your president and I am incredibly proud to be the first female president in the VSDCA. It has been an amazing experience, and there are many people to thank. For those that have lent an ear, answered a phone call for advice, volunteered their time throughout the season, I sincerely thank-you. I am proud to see the work that has gone into the junior program, and know that the juniors are in great hands with Chris Wilks and see some of our younger players become a voice at the club and take on leadership roles.

The committee is already working hard behind the scenes with exciting changes to the traditional coaching structure, which is part of a larger club-wide structure, driven to provide greater development of the playing group moving forward. ## TREASURER'S REPORT

Kevin Roberts, the relatively new CEO of Cricket Australia, recently made the following comments in relation to club cricket in Australia:

*"Cricket clubs, like all club sport, face retention challenges in an increasingly time-poor society. As a volunteer, I also appreciate that leading a cricket club is becoming harder and new volunteers are not always lining up to help the club stalwarts. The commitment to supporting volunteers and making sure the game has a successful and sustainable future is one of Australian cricket's top priorities under my leadership."*

The comments ring very true for the Balwyn Cricket Club (**Club**). The Club faces significant challenges, both financial and non-financial. I will focus on the financial issues in this report.

The Club will (for accounting purposes) record a loss for the financial year ended 30 April 2019 in the amount of \$16,923.74. A loss in those very significant terms is misleading because it is attributable in large part to an accounting stock adjustment which has been undertaken for this reporting period (in an amount of \$10,537). However, it remains clear that the Club continues to face real difficulty in achieving even a "break even" financial outcome.

By reference to the Club's financial statements, I make the following comments in particular:

- As a starting point, the Club has struggled to adjust to a financial environment that no longer includes an Administration Grant from Cricket Victoria. This immediately makes a \$10,000 to \$15,000 difference to the bottom line compared with historical years. The challenge is to find new income streams to make up the difference.
- The Club's membership Subscriptions amounted to \$35,631.66, which was roughly equivalent to the income from Subscriptions of \$37,387.05 in the previous year.
- It was particularly pleasing that the Club was able to secure an additional \$3,000 from Golden Tiger membership, which the Club hopes will continue to improve significantly as an income stream in the years ahead. The Club really does require the financial support of its past players and community more generally.
- It is worth noting that the Club discarded the "early bird" discount on player subscriptions this financial year. The Club acknowledges that this increased the subscription burden for many members. However, the final figures show that there was no real difference in income achieved. This can be explained by the Club's relatively young current membership, which reduces the amount of the subscriptions paid.
- The Club continued to perform strongly in Social and Fundraising income, by raising an amount of \$23,876.52 (down slightly on previous years).
- The Club gathered over \$20,000 by way of income from Sponsors. This was the highest sponsor income ever achieved by the Club, and reflects the significant effort and expertise that Nicole Jackson-Kiker has contributed in this area.
- David Strybosch has focussed on exploring opportunities for the Club to derive grant income and has started to have success in this regard. The Club will need to continue these efforts into the future.
- The Club invested heavily in new merchandise from Kookaburra after some disappointing recent outcomes with other suppliers. There should not need to be any further investment in the space in the foreseeable future.



- A very substantial expense continues to be Coaching and Professional Player related expenses (an amount of just over \$20,000 this year). This was a reduction on previous seasons, but it was still a significant expense.

The Club will continue to implement the following strategies / initiatives for next year to improve its financial performance:

- Exploring alternative sources of Grants.
- Continue to make social functions more attractive for non-members of the Club.
- Continue to build on the very significant progress made in Sponsorships over the last two years.
- Reduce expenditure on Coaching and Professional player related items.
- Encourage greater Past Player involvement in the Club, and associated financial support.

The Club requires the support of its entire community (players, past players, and supporters) in order to continue to survive, and thrive, as a leading turf cricket club in its area. But we all need to rise to the challenge to guarantee the Club's future.
